

Tourism – A \$4.7 trillion business

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Die Einheit bietet Schülerinnen und Schülern die Möglichkeit, das Thema „Tourismus“ aus mehreren Blickwinkeln zu beleuchten. Welche positiven und negativen Auswirkungen hat Tourismus auf die beliebtesten Gegenden? Wie hat sich die Tourismus-Industrie seit der Corona-Pandemie verändert, und wie könnten Reisen in Zukunft aussehen? In der Reihe beschäftigen sich die Lernenden mit diesen und weiteren Fragen, erweitern ihren thematischen Wortschatz und trainieren insbesondere ihre Kompetenzen im Lese- und Hör-Seh-Verstehen.

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Competences and skills:

By working with several texts, cartoons and some pictures, students train their **reading comprehension skills** as well as their **analysing competences**. Throughout the unit, they continually learn and improve their writing skills and enhance their vocabulary knowledge. Students also improve their **listening and viewing competences** by engaging with three videos and practise their **speaking skills** by giving presentations.

Reading comprehension



- In key points, summarise the text.
- Explain the effect the lack of tourism is having on wildlife conservation and communities.

Working with the text

- Analyse the situation regarding the rangers.
- Demonstrate that species and natural environments are under attack from more than just the collapse of the ecotourism industry.

Discussion



- Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of ecotourism. Consider local communities, the natural world, and the tourists themselves. Some points to include could be:

awareness – education – wildlife familiarity – local income – research – footprints – sustainability – disturbance – number of visitors – reliance – resentment – resources – protection

- Write an article for the travel section of an international magazine using one of the following titles:
 - Dependency on Tourism*
 - My holiday footprint – my choice*

Explanation (hidden) gems: The video mentions hidden gems that are suddenly overrun by visitors due to geotagging. In the cartoon, the island would appear to be representative of a desert island beauty spot, undisturbed until discovered by a package tour company.

6. Study the cartoon and do the following tasks.

a) Describe the cartoon and suggest why the cartoonist has drawn it.

The cartoon is labelled *The Desert Island Package* and is simply drawn in black and white. It shows a large cruise ship anchored just off a small desert island. The ship dwarfs the island emphasising its size. Four tourists appear to have been brought to the island, which consists of one palm tree and a few square metres of land, by two sailors in a rowing boat. These crew members look amused at the activities of their guests. The island's visitors, three men and a woman, dressed in T-shirts and shorts, are taking photos of the palm tree. One person is having to stand in the sea to be able to take the photograph, which indicates how small the area of land is.

The cartoonist is making many observations about the holiday package industry and in doing so allows the observer to interpret situations. The cruise ship is huge and has brought thousands of guests to a small, previously isolated island. Cruise ships visiting small places and dominating the skyline, for example in Venice, is well-known and objected to by many people. The behaviour of tourists is also portrayed. Often their only interest is to see the places they visit through a camera lens, including using a mobile phone and taking selfies. The cartoon is effectively a critical observation of tourists and the tourist industry.

c) Express your views about cruise ships.


